As president of our largest state Nurse Practitioner organization, I'd like to give you an overview of what your elected executive team does in support of you as members and in support of NPs throughout this state. As of March 1, 2014, Arizona has 4,540 active NPs, 705 CRNAs, 213 CNMs and 201 CNS, for a total of 5,659 Advanced Practice Nurses (APNs). Many of you have heard of the national movement for states' to align with the Consensus Model crafted by The National Council of State Boards of Nursing (NCSBN) as a gold standard for Scope of Practice (SOP) based on recommendations from the Institute of Medicine (IOM) report on The Future of Nursing (2008). consensus model offers a standardized SOP. where APNs in all 50 states plus our territories would have the privilege and regulatory support to practice to the full extent of our education and training. In Arizona, we have one of the most favorable and expansive SOP as NPs. We are considered a plenary state, where we as NPs have statutory and regulatory independence to practice to the fullest extent of our education and training without physician oversight. Other APN specialists have more limitations on their SOP, which

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includes more physician oversight and collaboration. We all work in teams and collaboratively with physician colleagues and other healthcare providers, but mandates that limit our ability to do what we are educated to do can negatively impact access to care for our patients. The Council (AzNPC) is taking an active role in Meeting with our fellow APNs to explore opportunities to update language in our state Nurse Practice Act (NPA) that would better align all APNs in Arizona with the consensus model.

Many of you have attended the monthly educational dinners AzNPC has sponsored through the diligent work of Nancy Johnson and our Public Relations and Membership Chairs, Katie Wall and Amber Porter. These meetings provide a wide range of primary and specialty care educational updates as well as opportunity for networking among NP colleagues. Northern Arizona holds similar monthly programs through NANPG and Southern Arizona holds dinner programs as well as an annual Primary Care update for NPs in the Tucson area. Our annual Regional NP Symposium held the last full weekend in July each year provides opportunity for NPs to gather for legislative updates, educational sessions, networking and faceto-face time with AzNPC officers to assist in moving our organization's activities forward

In addition to these priority issues, we as your elected officers attend dozens of meetings with stakeholders and policy makers to represent NPs in our state. These meetings do not make the news often; however these behind the scene activities drive issues such as NP insurance empanelment, reimbursement and our visibility as quality providers. Led by Denise Link, our legislative Chair, executive officers actively participate in and monitor state and federal health policy and state legislative bills to protect our NPA and SOP and to improve and protect our patients' having access to our care as NPs. Our Public Relations Chair Katie Wall works tirelessly to update and maintain our website for students, NPs, stakeholders and the public at large. Question: I am a pediatric nurse practitioner. If I get a Doctor of Philosophy in Nursing (Ph.D.) or a Doctor of Nursing Practice degree Can I refer to

myself as a "Dr." if I have a (DNP)? Can my business card read say Dr. Jane Smith?

Answer:

Rule R4-19-403 (23) states:

Advertising the practice of nursing with untruthful or misleading statements

Arizona Revised Statute §32-1636 states that:

Only a person who holds a valid and current certificate issued pursuant to this chapter to practice as a registered nurse practitioner in this state may use the title "nurse practitioner", "registered nurse practitioner" or "nurse midwife", if applicable, or use any words or letters to indicate the person is a registered nurse A person who is practitioner. a registered nurse certified as practitioner shall indicate by title or the initials specialty area of certification.

The title "Dr." is not a protected title. A Doctor of Nursing Practice (DNP), and a Doctor of Philosophy (Ph.D.) are academic degrees. However, when functioning in the capacity of a healthcare provider, in order ovoid the appearance misrepresentation, you are required to include your nursing credentials. example, Dr. Janeen Dahn Family Nurse Practitioner is perfectly appropriate. By clarifying that I am a family nurse practitioner, there is no confusion on my credentials. Go ahead and use your title vou earned it!

12/14/13 Denise Link – AzNPC Legislative Chair Advocacy in Action - Az NP Council Legislative Report

The AzNA Public Policy Committee has been very active reviewing 74 bills this session. See the Nurses' List on the AzNA website for the full list of bills that have been reviewed; reviewer comments, status and AzNA position are listed. AzNA members and staff continue to advocate for improvements in the following bills:

HB 2573 schools; immunizations; registered nurses; posting – would require schools to post immunization levels on their website; would require schools to post if they do/do not have a registered nurse on site.

SB 1157 Midwives; scope of practice – prohibits licensed midwives (not CNMs) from attending home births for VBAC, multiple births and breech presentations.

SB 1276 HIV-related testing; consent; confidentiality; exceptions – Amendments have been proposed to address concerns of the sponsors while preserving patient autonomy and confidentiality.

This year's Day at the Legislature was in collaboration with the American College of Physicians/Arizona Chapter. Last year a limited number of members of the executive committee for Chapter 9 attended at the invitation of the ACP/AZ and found it to be a very positive experience. This year, attendance was opened to 15

members; a combination of 9 members and DNP students participated. The day was very informative and included presentations by 4 members of the Arizona Legislature, three legislative representatives including AzNA Legislative council, Rory Hays, and three policy experts, including Don Hughes, Gov Brewer's Special Consultant for Telemedicine and Graduate Health Medical Education funding were discussed during visits with legislators. The feedback from attendees was positive. Future participation by AzNA will depend on what issues are under consideration in the legislature and opportunities to have greater input for agenda, speakers and advocacy topics for the day.

The Consensus Model Legislation Workgroup – met on Feb 12th at AzNA office. Topics of discussion included the VA/ APRN action and Dear Colleague letters; bullet points of "wants" for proposed legislation to be prepared by representatives from each role to be presented and discussed at next meeting; review of draft of potential stakeholders/supporters for scope practice legislation; proposal to have future large group meetings via teleconference to encourage broader participation. The date for the next meeting is planned for March 19, 2014.

Denise Link made the following appearances on behalf of AzNA/AzNPC – AzNA Board of Directors Retreat, January 31st – topics: strategic planning, expert panel topics, increasing value for members, consumer/member messages, financial planning; attended Day at the

Legislature on Feb 5th; Consensus Model meeting, Feb 12th; Speaker at the AzNA workshop "Nurses Making Public Policy Purposeful" on Feb 14th; Speaker at the SNAAz mid-year convention on March 1, 2014 at the ASU Downtown Phoenix Campus. Topic at the workshops was the impact of health policy decisions on nursing practice and how to advocate for our profession and for patients; Speaker at AzNA Lobby Day, briefing attendees on SB 1157 Midwives; scope of practice and served as a group leader for visits with legislators; Participated in stakeholders meeting to discuss amendments to SB 1276 HIV-related testing.
